

PE and Sports Funding – Impact report 2017/2018

From DFE guidance, Newington Green chose to prioritise the funding in 2017/2018 under the following headings:

- To improve the quality and outcome of swimming provision in Key Stage 2
- To provide high quality dance provision in line with the school curriculum
- To maintain after school sports club provision
- To maintain high level of participation in sports competitions.

To improve the quality of swimming in KS2

In 2017/18 we made the decision to sign up to GLL's intensive swimming course. The intensive format is designed for children to access high quality school swimming provision by attending 1 hour lessons every day over a 2 week period. The lessons are taught by 3 swimming teachers instead of 1, enabling the class to be differentiated effectively and making far greater progress over a short period of time. Over the 2 week period every child made progress with their swimming ability according to the assessment data we received from GLL.

To provide high quality dance provision in line with the school curriculum.

The quality of dance teaching was high this year due to being able to draw on the expertise of a professional dance teacher to assist with the teaching of some PE lessons. This was also used as a CPD opportunity to upskill the dance teaching skills and knowledge of our PE teacher. This had a positive impact on pupils progress within the dance unit covered in PE. We also ran a lunch time dance club which saw 16 pupils attend on a weekly basis.

To maintain after school club provision.

Our extra-curricular sports club programme increased slightly compared to the previous years.

To maintain a high level of participation in school sports competitions.

In 2017/18 NGPS entered 10 Islington sports competitions across the year which is an increase on the previous year in which we entered 9. Competitions entered were:

IPS football league, tennis, cricket, handball, basketball, netball, community football tournaments and hockey and London Youth Games tennis.

The highlight of these competitions was winning the Islington tennis tournament and then representing Islington at the London Youth Games.
