

# PE and Sports Funding – Impact report 2015/2016

From DFE guidance, Newington Green chose to prioritise the funding in 2015/2016 under the following headings:

- **provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively** (Resources for lessons and clubs)
- **introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport** (increase girls participation in PE)
- **run sport competitions**
- **run sports activities with other schools**

## Newington Green Specific targeted priorities:

Provide a wider range of extracurricular sports clubs.

To ensure a good range of competitions are entered by NG pupils.

Increase girl's engagement in PE and Sports.

Provide children opportunities to try elite sports.

## Funding received £9480

- Cost of staffing extracurricular sports provision: £4860
- Cost of Competition Service Level Agreement with London Borough of Islington: £1250
- Elite sporting experiences: £1346
- Resources to support improved teaching in PE £2024

## 1. Impact on Extracurricular sports clubs:

### Sports clubs attendance 2014/15

As the data shows there was an increase in the amount of children attending the extracurricular activities in 2015/16, with all of the clubs full to capacity on a weekly basis. Girl's participation also grew from the previous year from 55 to 69. This will be a continuing priority.

### 2. Impact on Sports competitions participation 2015/16

In 2015/16 NGPS entered 7 Islington sports competitions across the year which is an increase on the previous year. Competitions entered were;

IPS football league, tennis, cricket, handball, basketball, netball, community football tournament.

### 3. Impact on Girl's engagement in PE and sport

Girl's engagement within PE and sport has been very positive in 2015/16. As mentioned within extracurricular data, the number of girls attending has increased from 55 to 69. Below is a short case study of a year 5 girl who has significantly become more engaged and confident within PE and school sport.

Case study – year 5 girl

E.I is a great example of a pupil who has significantly increased her level of PE and sporting activity. At the beginning of 2015/16 she was not the most enthusiastic child within PE lessons but this started to change once she began to attend the girl's multi sports after school club. After being encouraged by some of her friends to join the club she started to attend on a weekly basis, and it was evident to see her enjoyment and confidence grow when taking part in physical activity. Her engagement and performance increased within PE lessons as a result and by the end of the year was one of the highest achieving girls in her class in PE. She also represented the school in many of the sports competitions including, football and netball. During a case study interview she said "Going to girls multi sports club is really fun because we get to do lots of sports and learn new things. It has made me more confident in PE lessons because I know I've done the sports before." She also said, "I feel proud to play for the school teams because I know it means I've worked hard in PE and that I've done well."

#### **4. Impact on elite sporting opportunities**

In 2015/16 NGPS provided 2 elite sporting opportunities that the majority of children would not be able to experience outside of school.

##### **Year 5 trip to Docklands Sailing and Water sports Centre**

Both year 5 classes attended the Docklands Sailing and Water sports centre to take part in sailing and kayaking activities. None of the children had ever experienced any kind of sailing activities and it was a hugely successful and enjoyable day. Key quotes from the feedback gathered from children after the trip included;

"It was so fun to do because I had never done it before and learnt lots of new things."

"Time went so quick because it was really exciting."

"I want to do it again."

##### **Year 4 Archery workshop**

Case study – year 4 boy

A.L was chosen for a case study interview because although he is very sporty and performs well in PE, he is very much focused on just playing football and has had very limited experience of other types of sports/activities outside of school. It was interesting to hear from him and all of the positive things he had to say about taking part in the archery workshop.

"I liked using the bow and arrow because it was exciting and I have never done it before."

"It helped me improve my aiming."

"It was fun having a competition with my friends."

##### **In 2016/2017 we intend to spend the PE and School Sport money to meet the following objectives:**

\*Continue to develop range of extracurricular provision.

\*Continue sports competitions participation.

\*Continue to increase girl's engagement in PE and Sports.

\*Invest in dance teaching resources, to enhance teaching of dance in the curriculum.

\*Further elite sporting opportunities for children.
