Priority	Action	Success criteria	Cost	Timescale	Impact / evaluation
Transport to swimming lessons	Hire a mini bus from Islington travel services to take and collect children to and from swimming lessons.	Children attending GLL's week long intensive swimming programme and making greater progress with their swimming.	£800	Autumn term	After analysing the data provided by GLL, it showed that 100% of the students had made progress with their swimming. By the end of the course every child was able to swim at least 5 meters, with over 50% of the children being able to swim 25 meters or more. At the beginning of the course, 33% of the year group were non-swimmers.
To maintain after school club provision	Employ sports coaches to deliver specialist after school sports clubs.	High number of children engaging in and participating in extra-curricular sports clubs.	£9,500	Ongoing	We ran 9 different after school sports clubs this year with a total of 105 children attending across the year. These clubs were accessible for children across both KS1 and KS2. We also continued our theme of running some girl's only clubs which continued to be successful with attendance reaching maximum numbers.

To maintain participation in out of school sports competitions	To sign up to Islington sports and competition package. Provide supply cover for Sam to attend the competitions with the teams. Sam took the sports teams to all 10 competitions. The girl's football team won a trophy at the Islington football tournament.
Improve the quality of dance.	To employ a dance specialist teacher to deliver lessons and provide Sam with further CPD in dance teaching.	We hired Natasha for London Dance Factory to come in for a half term and deliver dance lessons during Year 6 PE lessons. She also worked with Sam to upskill his knowledge and ability to teach dance to the rest of the school.	£600	Spring term	100% of the 36 targeted children assessed in PE made excellent progress during the dance unit. Excellent progress was determined by a child meeting each dance lesson learning objective on 3 separate occasions.  100% of year 6 children also achieved their end of key stage dance expectation.
Improve PE equipment/resources	Purchase sports and PE equipment to improve and the quality of teaching in PE lessons.	We purchased new equipment including balls, tennis nets, markers, bibs and football goals.	£1,000	Autumn term	Ensuring there were enough balls for one per child enabled children to have a higher amount of active learning time during PE lessons instead of having to share or wait for their turn. The new equipment assisted in the quality of teaching and progress made by the children within PE lessons as is reflected within the attainment data below.
