MATHS

This week we are re-visiting addition! Think of an addition sum and say it out loud- can your child write it down? Extra points for putting the addition sign (+) and equals sign (=) in the correct places.

Next can you make this sum with objects in your house? It might be two pieces of pasta and five pieces of pasta, then counted altogether. Finally what is the answer? Can you write the answer? Recap that in addition the answer will always be a bigger number than what we start with because we're counting them **ALTOGETHER**.

This can be made easier or harder by changing the numbers around. You could even move on to using a number line to do these

This week practice the 'ea' phoneme and grapheme. This is found in **bean**stalk. Make a list of 'ea' words. Write them on green paper leaves to make your own beanstalk!
